

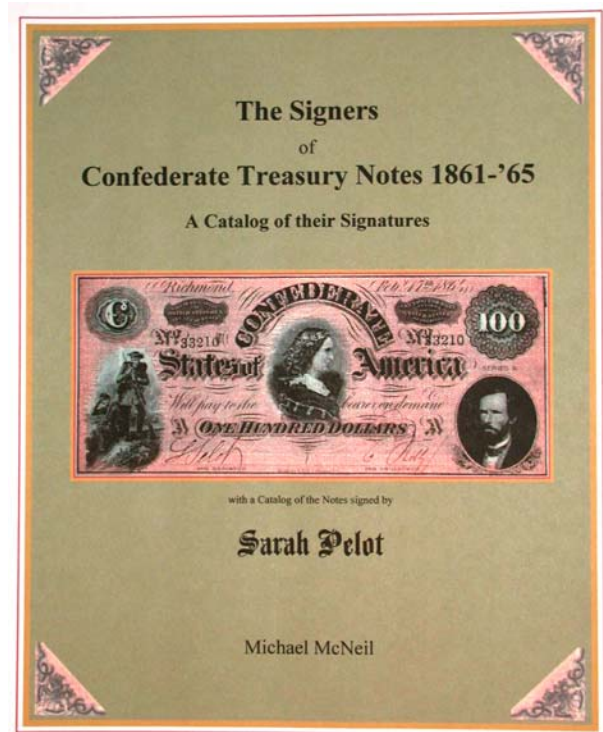
A new book for the serious collector of Confederate Treasury notes.

For the first time, you can now positively identify the signatures on your CSA notes with a resource book containing high-quality, full color images of nearly four hundred signatures.

This is an especially useful tool in identifying the signatures in the February 17th, 1864 Issue. Roughly half of the records of this issue are missing in Thian's *Register of the Confederate Debt*, the only tool previously available for identifying signatures.

New research from Duke University and the work of Raphael Prosper Thian has resulted in a full chapter devoted to the history of the Confederate Treasury-Note Bureau along with the women and men who signed these notes.

Other chapters explore the methods of organizing a signature collection, using the author's collection of notes signed by Sarah Pelot as an example.
